Gold Standard Course – Spots Still Open for 2022-23

The 2021-22 Gold Standard Course on Commercial Arbitration was a big success, with 24 students completing the course, taught by faculty members **Lisa Munro, Megan Keenberg, Eric Morgan**, Professor Josh Karton and **Doug Harrison** (Course Director). Also joining the faculty over the 17 sessions from September 2021 to May 2022 were 25 guest lecturers, including TCAS members **J. Brian Casey, Myriam Seers, Marc Goldstein, Stephen Morrison, Janet Walker, Cynthia Kuehl, Hon. Barry Leon, Louise Barrington, Dave McCutcheon, Alison FitzGerald, Stephanie Cohen, Joel Richler, Bill Horton and Junior Sirivar**. Thanks to all!

The 2022-23 course, which will be taught on Zoom, is still open for registration (if in-person/hybrid sessions are held, they will be at Arbitration Place in Toronto). The first session is on Saturday,

September 10. Thereafter, it will be held on Wednesday evenings (generally every second week) from 6:15 to 8:30 pm, with the final session on Saturday, May 6, 2023.

Successful completion of the course permits you to apply to the ADR Institute of Canada for its Q.Arb designation.

Prior students have said this was “the best course I have taken on any topic during my professional career” and that the “curriculum has the right balance of theory and practice ... Highly recommended!”.

Tuition for TCAS members is only \$1,300, which includes a copy of the 4th edition of **J. Brian Casey’s** *Arbitration Law of Canada*, and Alexander Gay and Alexandre Kaufman’s *Annotated Ontario Arbitration Legislation*, a combined \$300 value.

Annual General Meeting and Conference

The 2022 AGM and Conference, held in-person (with a virtual option) at the National Club on May 31, opened with a fascinating panel on Diversity, Allyship and Arbitration, moderated by **Dr. Todd Weiler** (co-leader of the ICC’s Disability and Inclusion Task Force).
